Children and Youth Program

Welcome back to another exciting year of programming for the children and youth in our pastoral charge.

A number of exciting changes have been made to Sunday School this year. As of September 2012, the Spark workshop rotation curriculum was implemented. Children engage in Bible stories using the new Spark Story Bible with its colourful illustrations and dramatic dialogue. Following the story, the children participate in various workshops that rotate each week: art, cooking, video, games, drama, music, and science. Parents/guardians are now able to register their children for Sunday School using an online registration system (http://topsailunitedchurch.sparksundayschool.org/users/register).

The Children's Choir, under the direction of Rosalind Foley, continues to be a much-loved ensemble within the congregation. New members aged 6 or older are encouraged to join. The Youth Band & Singers, under the direction of Brett Vey and Rosalind Foley, continue to lead our Family Services every 3rd Sunday of the month. This very versatile group is open to junior high, senior high, and university/college students. The Youth Band & Singers welcomes new members. Repertory ranges from traditional tunes to modern pop/rock.

Plans are underway for a Youth event to begin in fall 2012 with a theme of "Becoming a Good Samaritan." This series will feature video-interviews with well-known speakers such as: Eugene Peterson (author of "The Message" Bible paraphrase), Tony Campolo (Christian teacher, author, and sociology professor), Gary Haugen (President of International Justice Mission), Archbishop Desmond Tutu (Nobel Peace prize winner and major opponent of apartheid in South Africa), Chuck Colson (the founder of "Prison Fellowship"), Jim Wallis (founder and editor of "Sojourners Magazine"), Richard Stearns (President of World Vision), and Ron Sider (author of the seminal justice book "Rich Christian In An Age of Hunger"). Each session will focus on a particular topic including: Who Is My Neighbor?, How to Fight Global Epidemics and Prevent Diseases, How Fairness Changes People, Communities, and Nations, How Best to Serve Those In Need, Why Environmental Stewardship Is Biblical and Beneficial, and How to Care for the Disabled, Orphaned, and Incarcerated.

Each topic will be illustrated with references to popular movies, films, video games, and school-yard culture. Food, fun, and games are always part of each meeting. This is a safe place for youth to be themselves and to wonder about the world around them. Church membership is not required to participate, and youth can freely express their doubts and ideas without fear of judgment. We strive to create a welcoming environment where diversity is honoured.

Roofing Fund

As part of our ongoing maintenance, the church roof is in need of repair due to ongoing problems with leaks and the risk of mould and mildew. The Official Board has approved an expenditure of up to \$25,000 to have the entire roof reshingled. This will include an ice/water membrane applied over the entire surface as added protection against future leaks. We are asking for your support through donations to the **"Roofing Fund"** to offset the \$25,000 cost.
